Devotional

Adam & Eve

“And the LORD God said, It is not good that the man should be alone; I will make him an help meet for him.” After Adam had named all the living animals there was still not a help meet found for Him so God caused Him to fall into a deep sleep and took a rib of Adams’ and made a woman, Eve. An thus God made the beginning of the first family, one man and one woman, Adam & Eve, in perfect fellowship with God.

Now the crafty serpent had asked Eve, If God had not allowed them to eat of the trees of the Garden, and Eve responded they could not touch or eat of the tree in the midst of the garden or they would die. But the serpent placed doubt and desire to be like God in Eve’s mind, “Ye shall not surely die: For God doth know that in the day ye eat thereof, then your eyes shall be opened, and ye shall be as gods, knowing good and evil. So she ate of the forbidden fruit and gave it to Adam who ate of it also.

Suddenly their eyes were open and they knew the knowledge of good and evil. Sin had just entered into the world as they disobeyed God and their perfect fellowship with God was broken. They knew they were naked and sewed fig leaves together to try and hide their nakedness and they hid themselves from the presence of the lord amongst the trees of the garden. Sometimes when we sin we try to hide from God also, we try to run from our sin and hide it from God and oth-

ers, or we try to perform good works to cover up our sins. What we should do is to confess our sins to Jesus knowing that He is the only one that can forgiven our sin and take it as far as the east is from the west. Why He even takes our shame away! Thank God that in time that we fail and sin God even comes looking for us as He did Adam and Eve, And the LORD God called unto Adam, and said unto him, Where art thou?

But when God sought them out Adam and Eve didn’t do this, they never took the blame personally for their sins. Adam blamed his wife Eve and she blamed the serpent, and this first sin had lasting consequences for Adam, Eve, and the Serpent. Unconfessed sin in our life has lasting consequences in our lives too, mainly a broken relationship with the one who loves us most, God, and he so longs to be the biggest part of your life right now!

Maybe as you read this message you know that God is seeking you out to right your relationship with Him by telling about the sin you’ve been carrying. Give it to Jesus! Just as God made animal skins to replace the fig leaves Adam and Eve made to hide their sins, only he can, by the perfect sacrificial blood of Jesus, cast away all your sins, and make you white as snow.
