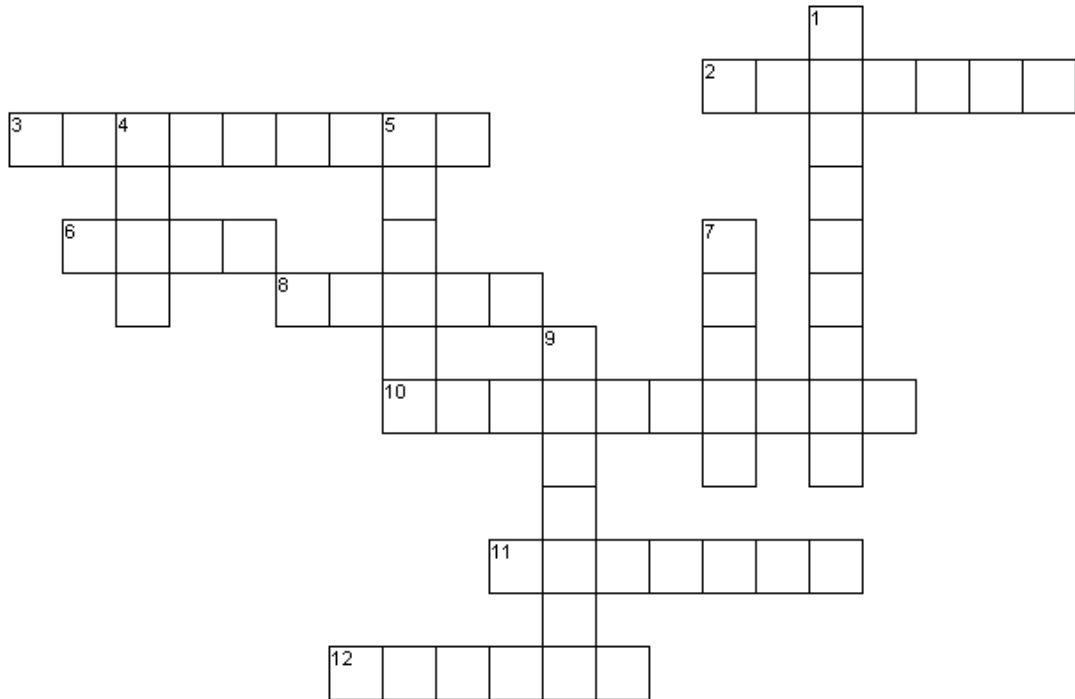

13 Now that same day two of them were going to a village called Emmaus, about seven miles from Jerusalem. 14 They were talking with each other about everything that had happened. 15 As they talked and discussed these things with each other, Jesus himself came up and walked along with them; 16 but they were kept from recognizing him.

17 He asked them, "What are you discussing together as you walk along?"

18 They stood still, their faces downcast. One of them, named Cleopas, asked him, "Are you only a visitor to Jerusalem and do not know the things that have happened there in these days?"

19 "What things?" he asked.

20 "About Jesus of Nazareth," they replied. "He was a prophet, powerful in word and deed before God and all the people. The chief priests and our rulers handed him over to be sentenced to death, and they crucified him; 21 but we had hoped that he was the one who was going to redeem Israel. And what is more, it is the third day since all this took place. 22 In addition, some of our women amazed us. They went to the tomb early this morning 23 but didn't find his body. They came and told us that they had seen a vision of angels, who said he was alive. 24 Then some of our companions went to the tomb and found it just as the women had said, but him they did not see."

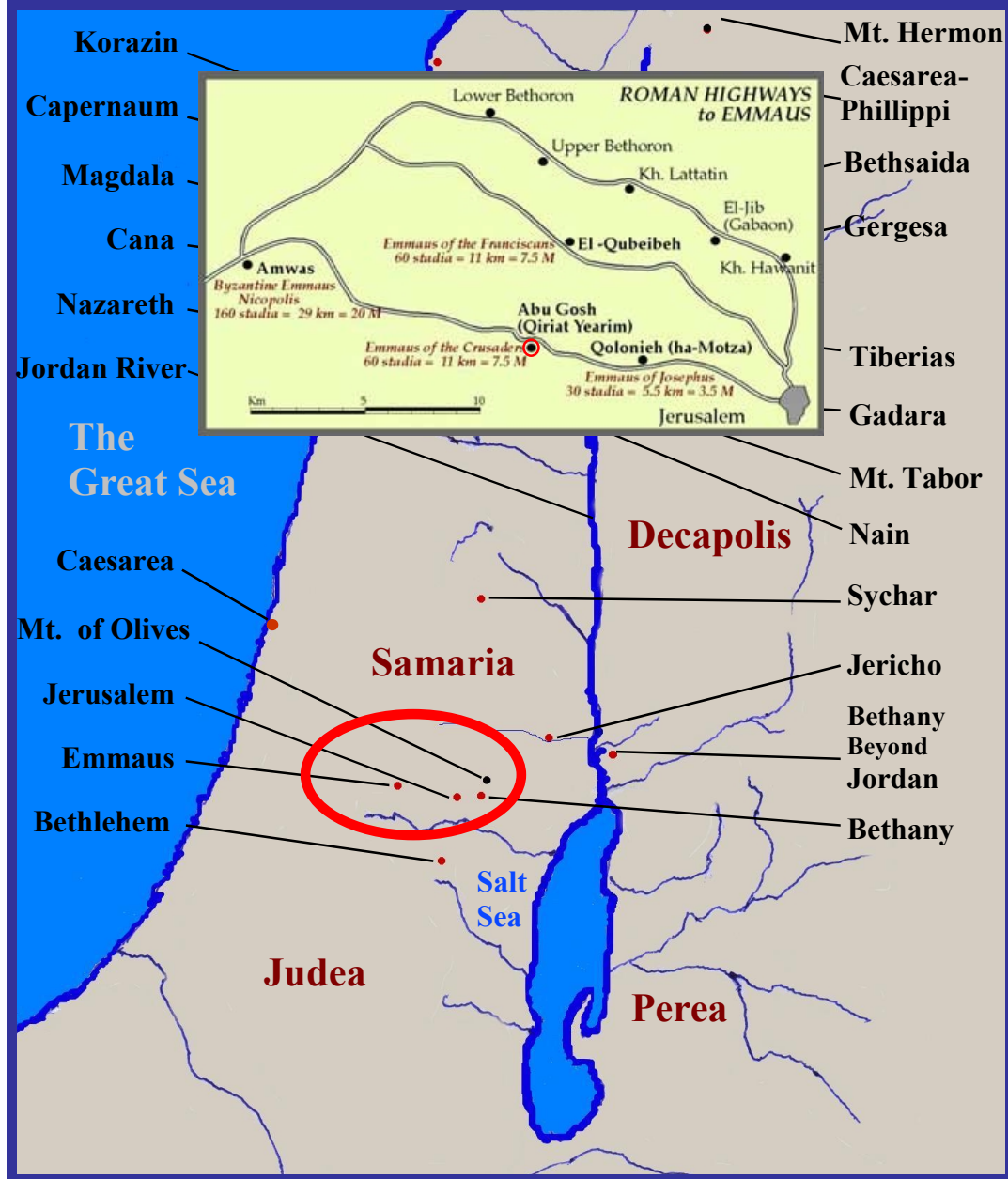
25 He said to them, "How foolish you are, and how slow of heart to believe all that the prophets have spoken! 26 Did not the Christ have to suffer these things and then enter his glory?" 27 And beginning with Moses and all the Prophets, he explained to them what was said in all the Scriptures concerning himself.

28 As they approached the village to which they were going, Jesus acted as if he were going farther. 29 But they urged him strongly, "Stay with us, for it is nearly evening; the day is almost over." So he went in to stay with them.

30 When he was at the table with them, he took bread, gave thanks, broke it and began to give it to them. 31 Then their eyes were opened and they recognized him, and he disappeared from their sight. 32 They asked each other, "Were not our hearts burning within us while he talked with us on the road and opened the Scriptures to us?"

33 They got up and returned at once to Jerusalem. There they found the Eleven and those with them, assembled together 34 and saying, "It is true! The Lord has risen and has appeared to Simon." 35 Then the two told what had happened on the way, and how Jesus was recognized by them when he broke the bread.

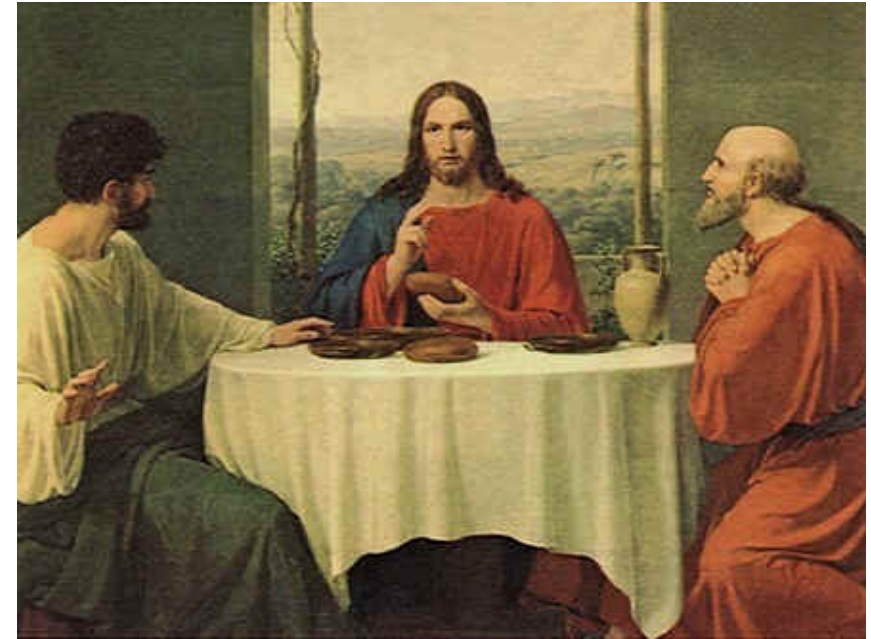

Key Points

- 1. As the two men walked along talking about Jesus, He showed up right in the midst of them. Keep your life and mind focused on Jesus and he'll be present in your life too.**
- 2. Your heart will burn too, as you let Jesus through the Holy Spirit reveal God's Holy Scriptures to you.**
- 3. The only way to recognize Jesus is when you break bread with Him, when you share sweet fellowship and communion with Him every day.**

Road to Emmaus



Emmaus - hot baths, a village "three-score furlongs" from Jerusalem, where our Lord had an interview with two of his disciples on the day of his resurrection (Luke 24:13). This has been identified with the modern el-Kubeibeh, lying over 7 miles north-west of Jerusalem. This name, el-Kubeibeh, meaning "little dome," is derived from the remains of the Crusaders' church yet to be found there. Others have identified it with the modern Khurbet Khamasa i.e., "the ruins of Khamasa", about 8 miles south-west of Jerusalem, where there are ruins also of a Crusaders' church. Its site, however has been much disputed.

Devotional

The Road to Emmaus is a story that takes place just after Jesus' death, burial, and resurrection. Two of Jesus' disciples were walking from Jerusalem to Emmaus, disheartened and without faith from the events about Jesus that transpired in Jerusalem, when Jesus joins them, but they were kept from recognizing Him.

Have you ever felt this way? Well the first thing Jesus did was to just show up, and Jesus makes that same promise to you today in God's Word.

Matthew 18:20 For where two or three are gathered together in my name, there am I in the midst of them.

Doing more than just showing up he asks them what they were discussing, and they were astounded. He didn't know of the occurrences that had just taken place at Jerusalem. Yet Jesus listened as they poured out their sorrow and disappointment, and their loss of faith as they demoted Jesus from the Messiah to a prophet. I think in their hearts they didn't even have faith, even though they knew of the women, two angels at the tomb, and Peter and John at the tomb seeing the body gone from the grave, to believe in the resurrection.

You see they were basing their faith on what they saw and what they heard by themselves and others. Here Jesus corrects them by telling them they were foolish not to have believed all that the prophets have spoken. And He began to explain to them how Christ must suffer and what was said in all the Scriptures concerning Himself. You see it's vital that we base our faith on God's Perfect Holy Word and nothing else.

Romans 10

17 So then faith cometh by hearing, and hearing by the word of God.

2 Timothy 3

16 All scripture is given by inspiration of God, ...

As the men neared their village, Jesus acted as if he was going father, but the men urge Him to come in, and he came in, sat at the table with them. He took bread, gave thanks, and as He began to hand it to them, they recognized Him, and He disappeared.

The men strongly urged him to come in, maybe they begged him to come in. But there was something that totally affected the hearts and faith of these men. Jesus could have showed them his nail-scarred hands, or the piercing of his side, but he chose to use God's Holy Scriptures to rekindle the faith these men needed as a first-century disciple. Look at what they said immediately after Jesus disappeared from their sight.

"Were not our hearts burning within us while he talked with us on the road and opened the Scriptures to us?"

Maybe now we can pause and take a step back to look at our own lives.

Will you walk with Jesus and cast all your cares upon Him? How far?

Is your heart burning today because you've given Jesus the opportunity to open the Scriptures to you?

Will your earnest worship invite Him in? Will you strongly urge Him to come in and stay with you?

Will you break bread with Him, have sweet fellowship, communion with Him?
