

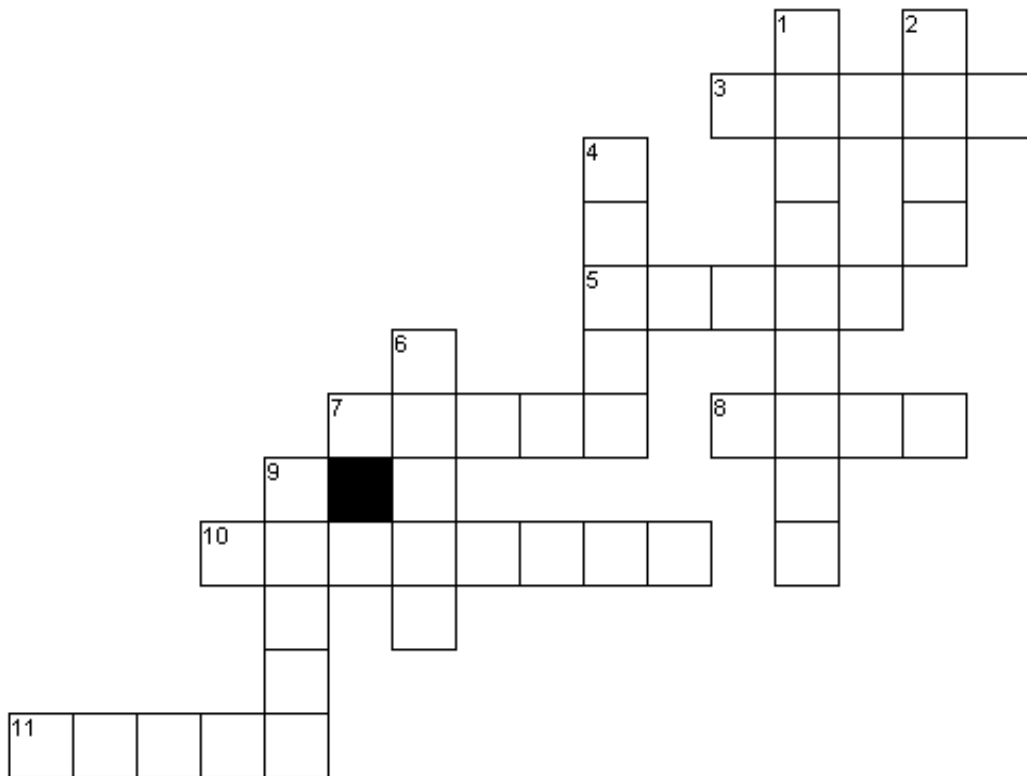

Now before the feast of the Passover, when Jesus knew that his hour was come that he should depart out of this world unto the Father, having loved his own which were in the world, he loved them unto the end. 2 And supper being ended, the devil having now put into the heart of Judas Iscariot, Simon's son, to betray him; 3 Jesus knowing that the Father had given all things into his hands, and that he was come from God, and went to God; 4 He riseth from supper, and laid aside his garments; and took a towel, and girded himself. 5 After that he poureth water into a basin, and began to wash the disciples' feet, and to wipe them with the towel wherewith he was girded. 6 Then cometh he to Simon Peter: and Peter saith unto him, Lord, dost thou wash my feet? 7 Jesus answered and said unto him, **What I do thou knowest not now; but thou shalt know hereafter.** 8 Peter saith unto him, Thou shalt never wash my feet. Jesus answered him, **If I wash thee not, thou hast no part with me.** 9 Simon Peter saith unto him, Lord, not my feet only, but also my hands and my head. 10 Jesus saith to him, **He that is washed needeth not save to wash his feet, but is clean every whit: and ye are clean, but not all.** 11 For he knew who should betray him; therefore said he, Ye are not all clean. 12 So after he had washed their feet, and had taken his garments, and was set down again, he said unto them, **Know ye what I have done to you? 13 Ye call me Master and Lord: and ye say well; for so I am. 14 If I then, your Lord and Master, have washed your feet; ye also ought to wash one another's feet. 15 For I have given you an example, that ye should do as I have done to you. 16 Verily, verily, I say unto you, The servant is not greater than his lord; neither he that is sent greater than he that sent him. 17 If ye know these things, happy are ye if ye do them. 18 I speak not of you all: I know whom I have chosen: but that the scripture may be fulfilled, He that eateth bread with me hath lifted up his heel against me. 19 Now I tell you before it come, that, when it is come to pass, ye may believe that I am he. 20 Verily, verily, I say unto you, He that receiveth whomsoever I send receiveth me; and he that receiveth me receiveth him that sent me.**

## The Upper Room



**Humility** - a prominent Christian grace (Rom. 12:3; 15:17, 18; 1 Cor. 3:5-7; 2 Cor. 3:5; Phil. 4:11-13). It is a state of mind well pleasing to God (1 Pet. 3:4); it preserves the soul in tranquillity (Ps. 69:32, 33), and makes us patient under trials (Job 1:22).

Christ has set us an example of humility (Phil. 2:6-8). We should be led thereto by a remembrance of our sins (Lam. 3:39), and by the thought that it is the way to honour (Prov. 16:18), and that the greatest promises are made to the humble (Ps. 147:6; Isa. 57:15; 66:2; 1 Pet. 5:5). It is a "great paradox in Christianity that it makes humility the avenue to glory."

**Jesus washes disciples feet.**

This story is one of love and humility and serving one another. Jesus and all the disciples were gathered for the Passover Feast. Jesus knew that the time had come for him to leave this world. It was the night before His crucifixion.

This was the very night of His betrayal. Jesus was setting an example to these men by serving them, that they likewise should serve each other . As always, He was concerned with meeting the needs of others and as He washed these men's feet it was intended to be a symbol of another washing, which was the cleansing from sin.

But by His example, He was instructing them that we need to serve one another. We should not put ourselves higher than another. We should be willing to perform what may seem the smallest,

most unimportant service towards one another because even those things are very important to Christ. By doing this, not only are we pleasing God, but we are being an example to the world and showing them God's unconditional love.

After he finishes he sat down again and began to tell them the significance of what he had just done. He also told them that He would be betrayed by the one who would eat bread with Him, and that He was telling them this so that they would believe He is who He says He is.

Jesus says that whoever receives whom He sends receives Him, and whoever receives Jesus receives Him that sent Jesus. He is telling the disciples that those that receive them as they preach His Words are also received by Him and the Father?
